The following is a sample induction service.

- Have your students help plan the service.
- Allow them to choose hymns.
- Create a chapter pledge for the students to follow
- Have them be a part by reading essays about the characteristics of a member (or have faculty member speak about each characteristic)
- The faculty advisor could speak about the accomplishments of the students who have applied.

Sample speech might be:

Ladies and Gentlemen, I wish to congratulate you on your selection into the Lutheran Junior Honor Association. The selection for this organization is not based on grades alone. Although each of you had to achieve a (#) for your GPA, you also had to list your accomplishments in service and activities. The faculty was asked to comment on your service and leadership, and then all these items were reviewed and voted upon. This was the process that landed you here this evening.

While the name Honor Association implies you will be academically accountable, the real purpose of this organization is to serve others and to lead in a positive manner. I know each of you are capable of doing this. How do I know this? Listen to some of the service activities that were listed on the applications: (list)

Knowing that these talents and more are found in each and every single one of you, I know that you, as our (inaugural inductees), will set an example for all future association

members. I know that you will serve our school and the community at large and represent our school well. I am confident that you will lead in a positive manner within our school as well as outside our walls. I also expect you to show good citizenship and character, but more importantly, I expect you to demonstrate the love of Christ in all that you do for that's part of discipleship. That's what our Honor Association will be about and how we will set our chapter apart from others. I'm looking forward to working with you and seeing you at work.
