A few months ago, I was able to share with a group of middle school students the life of A.G. Gaston. The point of my presentation was to have students learn history and then transfer this relevant knowledge to their own lives. A.G. Gaston's philosophy was both personal and

business; "success is founded on seeing and satisfying the needs of people." Early on in life, A.G. fulfilled needs - selling peanuts, loaning money, creating an insurance company, starting a bank, and building a business college. Financially, A.G. Gaston was worth close to \$150,000,000. But more important was his mindset. He was convinced that his fellow Black Americans could accomplish anything. The vocal refrain from A.G. Gaston was steady, "I am convinced, and I want to convince others." This is motivating news! This is inspiring! Let's continue to learn and grow together.
